How it works

Sun, Dec 5

Subpod works like a little compost factory. Your compost worms, and the beneficial microbes that live alongside them. are the workers! They take food scraps and carbon items (like paper or leaves) and turn it all into rich compost that builds soil and helps plants thrive. Subpod is an aerobic system, which means it promotes odorless microbes to boost the composting process, not smelly anaerobic ones. The unique 360 ventilation below Subpod's lid keeps fresh air cycling through your system.
